## **Background**

The Georgia Guidestones were a monument in Elbert County, Georgia, which were erected in 1980 by a pseudonymous individual known as "Robert C. Christian". The monument served as a guide for humanity under the guise of a apocalyptic event

### **Investigation**

The Elbert County Sheriff's Office is investigating the bombing, with assistance from the <u>Georgian Bureau</u> of Investigation. [3]

As of July 6, 2022, no arrests were made. [4]

### Aftermath of the bombing

One of the main Guidestones was entirely reduced to rubble. However, four remained intact and one was damaged. Due to the damage and instability of the remaining structure, the damaged Guidestones were demolished later that day. [5]
